'Hop on and off' the Rambler as many times as you like!*

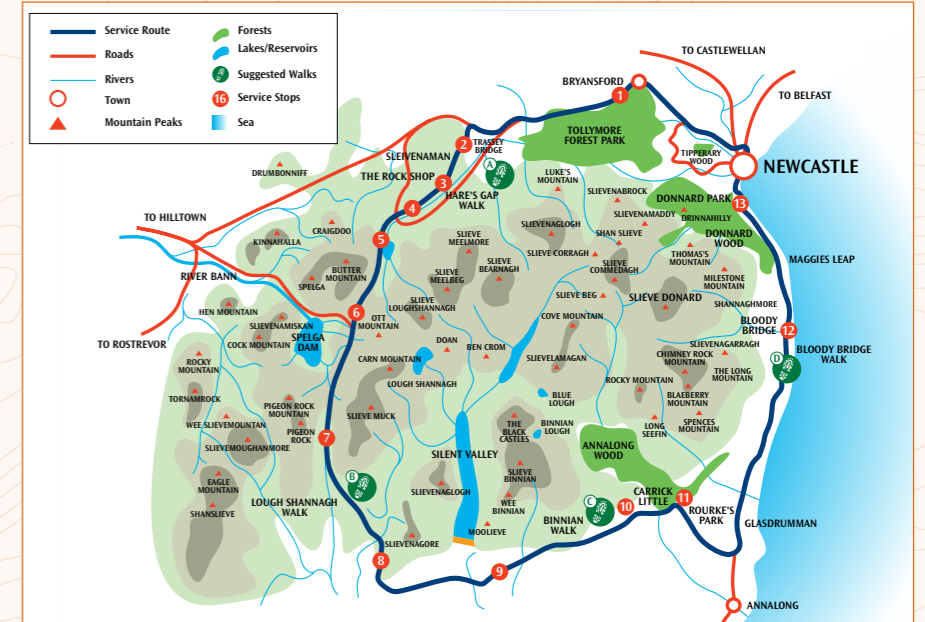

Attractions in the area

The Mourne Rambler Service will take you alongside Tollymore Forest and past the Spelga Dam. From the Silent Valley stop there is 200 acres of parkland with pleasant walks, lakes, restaurant, toilet facilities and information centre. (A shuttlebus operates all day, every day throughout July and August from the Silent Valley car park to Ben Crom Dam call 028 90 66 66 30 for timetable information). The service then continues along the coast road past Bloody Bridge where the Mountains of Mourne sweep down to the sea. **Remember, the weather can change very quickly in the mountains so make sure you take waterproof and windproof clothing.**
