# see SPERRIN

Southeast of Derry, the Sperrin Mountains rise up out of County Tyrone reaching their highest point at Sawel, from which you can see as far as the Foyle Estuary and across the Northern Ireland countryside to the Mourne. Home to golden plover, red grouse, and thousands upon thousands of fluffy white sheep.

Depart 1010 Magherafelt Union Road on the Sperrin Rambler 403 Service. Arrive 1100 Cranagh / Heritage Centre.

From the Heritage Centre at Cranagh follow the small road and then the track that runs south east up the glen past Sawlebeg to Lough Lark. Ramble through the glacial landscape (383 metres) to view Sawel and Dart Mountains. Return to Heritage Centre at Cranagh for 1430.

Depart 1440 Cranagh / Heritage Centre on the Sperrin Rambler 403 Service. Arrive 1533 Magherafelt Union Road.

Please note the above walk is a suggestion only.

The walk is not signed and therefore it would be advisable to have some map reading experience - see Ordnance Survey map sheet 13.
